Abstract

Postcolonial theory, which examines the effects colonialism had on knowledge and representations, has so far been largely ignored in political science and international relations. Yet even long after the era of colonialism ended, these effects are still alive and well, as can be illustrated by examples from German political science and international relations authors. And thus it turns out to be productive to engage postcolonial theorists and their concepts, and to ask how they can be applied productively to the study of political processes and institutions.



Aram Ziai is a Senior Researcher at the Centre for Development Research of Bonn University and a Heisenberg Fellow of the German Research Association. Earlier, he was a Professor of International Development at the University of Vienna and has taught at the universities of Hamburg, Kassel, Amsterdam, Aachen and Magdeburg. His areas of research are postcolonial and post-development studies, development theory and policy and global economic governance.
