## EUROPEAN UNION, VISEGRAD 4 AND JAPAN: TRADITION AND PROSPECTS FOR COOPERATION

## INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR IN PRAGUE

The rising economic and political relevance of East Asia and its importance for Europe contribute to the reshaping of the multipolar global order. The Visegrad 4 states are significantly integrated within the EU economic, political and security institutional frameworks, but still they seek to extend their trade and investment agenda further to non-EU territorial areas in order to sustain their economic and societal development. Besides the existing EU-PRC strategic partnership, Japan is the one highly relevant strategic Asian partner that represents a more compliant position for the EU and the V4 in terms of support for the global liberal order and the liberal international trade system. Japan as the leading Asian investor in the V4 continues to assume the role of the top Asian technology provider and partner in science and academia.

The seminar aims to review and assess the already existing knowledge of the common interests and develop further the scholarly debate on the mutual importance of the V4 and Japan in the global and European context. The suggested key topic of the seminar is global challenges in the field of economy and geopolitics in connection with developing strategic ties between the EU and Japan (including the ties between the V4 and Japan), particularly with the EU-Japan Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA). The related themes also include the 100th anniversary of the establishing of the Czechoslovak-Japan official relations, Japan's global balancing of the rising China, and the Japanese strategy for the V4 in terms of investments, high-tech research and cooperation, and support for multilateralism and the international liberal order in international organizations.
